Adoption of Special Kids

Edited from the AASK Web Site: In 1973, Adopt A Special Kid (AASK) was formed with a very simple principle in mind: It is every child's right to be a permanent member of a supportive family. This was the vision of AASK's founders, Dorothy and Robert DeBolt. The DeBolt's have parented 20 children, fourteen through adoption. The children they took into their home were not those traditionally viewed as being adoptable. They were children past infancy who had multiple challenges, including physical and developmental disabilities.

Adoption of older, special needs children is truly a gift to those kids and those who choose to do it are angels of mercy. We have dear friends who have adopted six special needs kids and we have watched as they have developed and grown healthier. There are currently over 117,000 children who are waiting for adoptive placements. Many of these are older children or sibling groups which puts them in the category of special needs.

He was motivated by a desire to help kids who had been sucked in to the destructive habits that surround the drug culture. Since it's first center opened in New York in 1960, Teen Challenge has grown to over 150 centers nationwide and over 100 centers in 60 other countries. In Puerto Rico the organization is building an AIDS hospital, the first of its kind.

Teen Challenge offers a number of services to the community, many times free of charge. For over 40 years, Teen Challenge has been going into schools around the world working with teens to educate them about the dangers of drugs. School teams consist of men and women who once had problems with drugs, so they know what they are talking about when they speak to teens. For younger children they have a puppet show that is used to educate them in a way that can easily be understood. Any school or Boy/Girl Scout troop that is interested in scheduling a visit should contact the nearest Teen Challenge center.
